THE MIRACLE WORKER

In this week's passage, we are reminded once again of Jesus' power - His ability to provide for the physical needs of His people, His command over the natural world and His control over diseases and sickness. And yet, in our humanity we can sometimes be blind to the full significance of these events.

REVIEW THE SERMON LEADER NOTES: Encourage your members to pull out their notes and review the main points of the sermon. (9-12 mins)

Read Mark 6:30-44. What do we learn about Jesus' identity and character from His response to the crowd, including His miraculous provision of food for them?

Read Mark 6:45-52. What lesson did the disciples fail to learn from the miraculous provision of food for the multitude (see v. 52)? How can we avoid being blind to that same lesson? ______

Read Mark 6:53-56. Does Jesus ever run out of power to heal people? What does it say about Jesus' power that the people merely had to touch his garment to be healed?

ASSESS YOUR LIFE

Is it possible that you are blind to certain lessons God is teaching you? What is the cause of that blindness and how can it be corrected?

In what ways has God provided for you (physically, spiritually, emotionally, etc.)? Name specific examples. Do you tend to view God as being stingy or generous?

Do you believe that God is capable of intervening miraculously in the world today? Do you believe He is willing? If so, what would that look like today?

APPLY THE TRUTH

In what ways can we help one another overcome our spiritual blind spots?

How can you become more grateful for God's generosity to you?

What would change in your life if you truly believed that God is capable and willing to work miracles in the world today?

COMMIT THIS WEEK

Commit to praying for one another this week, to helping each other recognize our blind spots, to be grateful for the generous provision of God in their lives, and to expect God's work in the world and in our lives as believers.
