Be On the Winning Side

Revelation 14:14-15:8

'...Revelation calms our fears and gives us hope, by showing us the outcome – God triumphs...'

1 REVIEW THE SERMON

LEADER NOTES: Encourage your members to pull out their notes and review the main points of the sermon. (9-12 mins)

Read Revelation 14:14-15:8

What happens to believers in vs. **14-16** (cp Matt. 13:30)?

What happens to unbelievers? What is the second harvest of the wrath of God (vs. **17-19**)?

What does the image presented tell us about the sheer volume of those people who hate God (vs. **20**)?

How are we reminded of the character of God throughout the images of glory and splendor mixed with wrath?

2 ASSESS YOUR LIFE

LEADER NOTES: Evaluate the condition of your lives in relation to the truth from God's Word. Encourage heart examination. (12-15 mins)

How can you be confident about which harvest you are a part of?

Does your life reflect the fruit of the Spirit, the mark of a believer? Do you ever struggle to relax knowing God is in control? When that occurs, how are you able to fight against panic, anxiety and fear?

How do you respond to the wrath that God is going to pour out on the unbelievers? How should you respond vs. **17-15:8**?

Does the idea of eternal worship of God ever leave you thinking that you will tire of it? Why do you suppose we often feel that this would be boring?

3 APPLY THE TRUTH

LEADER NOTES: Create a list of ways to close the gap between your lives and the truth of the Bible. Be practical and intentional. (12-15 mins)

.What should the image of the sea of glass mingled with fire impart to us?

As you grow in your walk with God how do you balance your love and trust with respect and reverence of Him?

How can we better rest in the assurance that God is enough, and that He will vindicate himself and his children?

4 COMMIT THIS WEEK

LEADER NOTES: Call your small group members to make a commitment and get the group working together to follow-up with each other. (9-12)

Will you faithfully keep in mind our reward for faithfulness is worship, more of God in this life and the next?

Rest in the assurance God is enough.
