REVIEW THE SERMON

Read Daniel 4. See verses 4-27. In your own words, how would you summarize Nebuchadnezzar’s dream and its interpretation? What was the main message God was communicating to Nebuchadnezzar through this dream?

What was Daniel’s counsel to King Nebuchadnezzar in response to this dream and its interpretation? Did Nebuchadnezzar heed Daniel’s advice?

See verses 28-33. Why did God inflict insanity on King Nebuchadnezzar as a punishment for his outrageous, prideful boasting? What does this tell us about the fundamental nature of sin and pride?

See verse 34. What ultimately brought Nebuchadnezzar back to his senses? How was his perspective changed after his humiliation?

In what ways do we see God’s grace and mercy toward King Nebuchadnezzar in this story? Why is this grace the more surprising, considering that Nebuchadnezzar was a pompous, arrogant tyrant? How is this story a picture of the Gospel?

What are some of the negative personal and social consequences of the prideful insanity that affects us all? Given these consequences, why do you think we’re still so drawn toward prideful self-exaltation?
