ASSESS YOUR LIFE

Could you ever imagine forgoing your freedom for a chance to share the Gospel? How would you respond if given the opportunity to stand before the Premier or Prime Minister knowing that your life would likely be on the line? Do you think you would be afraid of reprisal, or would you have boldness?______

How can the redemptive aspects of your past, how God changed you, and lifted your shame, be a powerful part of your testimony as it was for Paul?_____

How open to correction and calls to change are you? Do you find you are more like King Agrippa, wanting to hear what is being said, but stubborn hearted resisting the gift of conviction? Why or why not?_____

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APPLY THE TRUTH

Most of us will never have the chance to stand before Kings, however, we do have a sphere in which we carry influence. How can we take what we know to be true about the Gospel and share it with those in our sphere that don't know about the good news? How can we better do this in our place of work or in the public square, where there may be consequences for doing so? (*Remember, Paul actually sought out ministry opportunities in the midst of persecution*)

How should we respond to civil officials when we are treated unjustly? How can our testimony leverage these situations for God's glory?_____

How can we prioritize ministry in the midst of persecution? Paul never made it easy for persecutors to take advantage of him, but he was open to suffering for Christ no matter the cost. What do we learn from Paul in this regard? What was it about his understanding of purpose that gave him this strength? How can we better understand our purpose for this outcome?______
